Travel tips to China

In light of the evolving coronavirus (COVID-19) situation, China will resume visa issuance & lift some travel restrictions starting from 8 January 2023. Details are outlined in the below table:

Visa issue

According to the latest notice from the National Immigration Administration, passport, visa issuance and other facilitation measures will be implemented from 8 January, 2023. Details are as follows:

- Resume the acceptance and examination of foreigners' applications for the extension, renewal and re-issuance of ordinary visa, the issuance, renewal and re-issuance of stay permit, and the issuance, extension, renewal and re-issuance of residence permit. In case of urgent needs, expedited procedures may be applied for.
- 2) Resume the issuance of port visa, the implementation of the 24/72/144-hour visa-free transit policy, and the issuance of temporary entry permit in accordance with the law.

Travel measures

- Inbound travelers to China are advised to take a PCR test within 48 hours before their departure.
 People with a positive test result are advised to postpone their travels until they test negative.
 There is no need for travelers to apply for a health code from Chinese diplomatic and consular missions.
 They will declare their health status on the customs card.
- 2) Nucleic acid tests for international arrivals will be cancelled starting from 8 January 2023.
- 3) Those with an abnormal health status declaration or fever symptoms will receive an antigen test at customs. They will be advised to self-isolate at home until recovery or be treated in hospital, depending on their health conditions.

Flight information

- 1) Adjustment and control measures will no longer be implemented on international passenger flights, and both Chinese and foreign airlines could resume their scheduled passenger flights as per the arrangements prescribed in the framework of bilateral Air Service Agreements.
- Gradually resume accepting applications for international passenger charter flights from domestic and foreign airlines, and fully restore pre-pandemic processes and requirements in the summer and autumn of 2023.
- 3) The service procedures for inbound flights at each airport shall be optimized to improve operational efficiency, and the prevention and control requirements to personnel, space and facilities will be lifted, so as to fully release the supporting resources and enhance the accommodating capability to receive international flights.
- 4) Flights will no longer be classified by the level of risks, and passenger load factor (PLF) restrictions of no higher than 75% for inbound flights will be lifted.
